Visioning Grant Description

The Visioning Team leads and equips the Presbytery to live into its vision and mission. The Visioning Team is responsible for casting the vision of the Presbytery, communicating the vision and work of the Presbytery, and helping the Presbytery live and act within, and according to the vision. (Presbytery of Great Rivers Bylaws, Article IX, Section 1).

The Visioning Team, as of January 1, 2022, is eager to fund initiatives that help fulfill the goals of the 2020 Vision Statement of the Presbytery of Great Rivers or the values of Matthew 25 goals as articulated by the Presbyterian Church (USA) Matthew 25 Congregations program. Programs considered for Visioning Grant funding will include activities that transform, connect, support, spiritually engage, seek justice, resource, and/or focus the work of the Presbytery or Matthew 25 congregational goals. For more details on the Presbytery of Great Rivers Vision Statement and the Matthew 25 values, please see **Appendix I**, which follows the grant application.

Grant Criteria

Visioning grants will be awarded to initiatives with substantial involvement in or leadership by Presbytery of Great Rivers members and affiliated institutions. Visioning grants may be used to fund the programmatic costs of the proposed initiative. The grant may not be used for capital expenses or endowments. Grant recipients are eligible to re-apply annually for funding to support ongoing initiatives. Grant renewals will not be considered without completed program reports submitted at the conclusion of each annual grant cycle.

How to Apply

We encourage you to read the Presbytery's 2020 Vision Statement and the Matthew 25 values, found in **Appendix I**, prior to completing this application. If you believe your initiative helps fulfill one or more of our visioning goals, we encourage you to apply!

A complete Visioning Grant application will include the following items:

- 1. Completed Application Form
- 2. Official Endorsement Letter
- 3. Proposal Narrative (between 1-3 pages, single-spaced, 12 pt. font)
- 4. Line-item budget

Any applications received without <u>all</u> of the items above will be returned for completion. Each required item is discussed in greater detail below.

Required Application Materials

Completed Grant Application Form

Please fill out the grant application form below, which provides the Visioning Team with information about the program and the individuals who are responsible for overseeing a grant award.

Official Endorsement Letter

The proposal must be accompanied by a signed letter from the grant seekers' governing body. This should take the form of endorsement from a congregation's session or from a board of directors and accompany the completed proposal.

Proposal Narrative

Please prepare a proposal narrative no longer than 3 pages (single-spaced, 12 pt. font) that addresses the questions below.

- 1. **Title of Initiative and Brief Summary**: Provide a title for your initiative and include a *brief* (one paragraph) summary of your initiative. Please also include a list of any partners participating in the initiative.
- 2. Purpose and Activities: Please list which goals of the 2020 Visioning Statement and/or Matthew 25 values your proposed initiative helps achieve. What specific activities will help you achieve your stated purpose?
- 3. **Outcomes:** If your proposal outlines a new initiative, what outcomes do you hope for? If this is a continuation of an existing program, what are the outcomes so far?
- 4. **Sustainability Plan:** If this is an initiative that is anticipated to continue beyond one year, what efforts do you hope to undertake to sustain the initiative, both programmatically and financially?

Budget

Please prepare a line-item budget for the activities described in the proposal narrative and include this with your application. A sample budget template is included in **Appendix III**.

Instructions for Submitting Proposal Materials

Grants will be reviewed, and funds disbursed, on a rolling basis at quarterly Visioning Team meetings. Early applications are encouraged to ensure that the committee can review proposal

materials prior to the initiative launch, and to ensure that adequate funds are available. Incomplete applications will be returned for completion.

Appendix I: 2020 Presbytery of Great Rivers Vision Statement and Matthew 25 Values

Presbytery of Great Rivers 2020 Vision Statement

We are followers of Christ. We are a community of congregations and ministries bound together by God's love. We are humans who journey through blessing and brokenness, striving to be faithful, in need of connection and community, grace and repair, guidance and support, affirmation and encouragement, solidarity and celebration. We have faith that we have each been gifted and charged to a specific work of ministry in our particular time and place, the kind of work that changes lives. We are a people who accept that the ministry landscape is changing, and that we need each other, and we affirm that God is with us and at work in our midst. We are a body that tries to live faithfully together through covenants rooted in our love for one another and a polity that seeks to foster accountability to our promises to each other, a polity we have the collective power to change as needed.

TRANSFORM We aspire to change, to grieve and to let go, to ask new questions, to challenge old assumptions, to seek joy, and to build different structures that more closely align with our mission. We aspire to make space for new partners, to assist each other with how we may fit into new realities where we may be unsure. We want to move into a new future together.

CONNECT We aspire to be together, connected and connecting, to each other and God. We aspire to keep relationship first and to encourage collaborative ministry. We desire the presbytery to meet us where we are. We want to contribute where we can make a difference.

SUPPORT We aspire to support one another personally, professionally, and holistically, to build each other up, to bear one another's burdens, to create space for mutuality, solidarity, and support. We aspire to listen.

SPIRITUALLY ENGAGE We aspire to be spiritually overflowing and worshipfully engaged. We want to be inspired and to share that inspiration. We want to glorify God above all and recognize the divine in our midst, manifest in the multitude of gifts around us, filling every space in our presbytery. We aspire to have intentional moments of prayer for each other.

SEEK JUSTICE We aspire to accept and bless the range of identities in our midst, to embrace the leadership of peoples long silenced, so we may challenge each other and be enriched by the unique perspectives of others. We aspire to repair, reorient, rearrange, or reject what we must in order to build the "Kin-dom" of God on earth as it is in heaven.

RESOURCE We aspire to be resourced and resourcing, to teach and to learn, as we respond to the unique challenges of today. We want spaces to reflect on our effectiveness and sharpen our

discipleship, attentive to our heads, our hearts, and our bodies. We want to be strengthened, trained, and equipped for 21st century ministry in our local contexts.

FOCUS We aspire to rally around a unifying missional focus by uniting around our Matthew 25 identity, centering the needs of the people as if we were serving Jesus himself. We want to be a meaningful presence in our communities and honor Christ's Great Commission.

- Building congregational vitality by challenging congregations and their members to deepen and energize their faith and grow as joyful leaders and disciples actively engaged with their community, seeing new disciples engaged in ministry and longstanding believers develop in faith as the gospel of Jesus Christ is shared in word and deed.
- Dismantling structural racism by fearlessly applying our faith to advocate and break down the systems, practices and thinking that underlie discrimination, bias, prejudice and oppression of people of color.
- Eradicating systemic poverty by acting on our beliefs and working to change laws, policies, plans and structures in our society that perpetuate economic exploitation of people who are poor.

Program reports should be submitted no later than January 31 of the year following which the grant was received, unless an alternative arrangement has been approved by the Visioning Team. Program reports help us manage the outcomes of our work as a Visioning Team, as well as help grant recipients learn from their work. Program reports should be a minimum of one page, but no longer than 3 pages (single-spaced, 12 pt. font), include the program/initiative name and answer the following questions in narrative format. Photos or videos are encouraged!

1. Program Aims and Purposes

What are your grant program's key aims? How were the aims sharpened, changed or enhanced during the first year of planning and activity? How do these aims advance the mission of your institution?

2. Grant Activities

What key activities did you undertake in the last year? What activities advanced the initiatives or intent to meet the goals of the Presbytery of Great Rivers 2020 Visioning Statement?

3. Grant Accomplishments and Learnings

What were the program's most important accomplishments? (Identify two or three.) What are the most significant insights or discoveries? What surprises you? What lessons from this past year are worth sharing with others?

4. Sustainability and Partnerships

Who are your partners beyond your own institution? Describe how your partnership relationships are developing and working. If applicable, what is your plan for sustaining your program for the long term?
